Shortly after his death, Danny's family, friends and supporters formed the Daniel Pearl Foundation to perpetuate the ideals that inspired his life's work of bridge building and dialogue. The Foundation promotes cross-cultural understanding, encourages responsible and creative journalism, combats cultural and religious hatred, and advances tolerance through music.

A violinist, fiddler and mandolin player, Danny joined a band, orchestra or chamber group in every town in which he lived, forming new connections through his passion for music, friendship and humanity.

Daniel Pearl Music Day is a global network of performances, on or around the anniversary of Danny's birthday, October 10, that uses the language of music to promote tolerance and humanity.

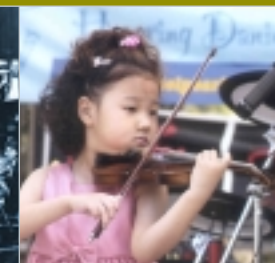

THE HISTORY It happened on February 22, 2002, a day after the world learned that kidnapped *Wall Street Journal* reporter Daniel Pearl had been brutally murdered by his captors in Pakistan. That night, George Pehlivanian, Danny's neighbor and friend from Paris, was scheduled to lead the Israeli Philharmonic Orchestra as a guest conductor. Deeply troubled by the news, he was reluctant to perform but defied the horror by proudly dedicating the concert to Danny.

"As the orchestra played Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5, I finally understood the triumph of hope over despair." said Pehlivanian. It was an emotional and exultant concert, ending with 15 minutes of sustained applause.

Thus the seeds were planted for Daniel Pearl Music Day – a worldwide day of promoting tolerance through music.

After Danny's funeral in August 2002, his family wrote: "As a tribute to his life and as a way to unite around his spirit, we

invite you to create or support a musical event in your community on Danny's birthday, October 10th." Music Day was born, and through the power of music an opportunity was created to elevate the unity of humanity above the differences that set us apart.



THE EVENTS Daniel Pearl Music Day was inaugurated on October 10, 2002. The idea took off with over 100 concerts in 17 countries. Individual musicians and musical groups ranging from small amateur bands to the symphony orchestras of Atlanta, Boston and Chicago, dedicated performances to the ideals for which Danny stood: friendship, tolerance and humanity. The second annual Daniel Pearl Music Day was an even greater and more powerful series of musical events. On and around October 10, 2003, the day that Danny would have turned 40, tens of thousands joined in "Harmony for Humanity" at over 230 concerts in 29 countries on 5 continents. From school children to the Masters of Persian Music, from African drummers to Jewish Cantors, classical ensembles, jazz groups and others around the world used music to form a global community based on tolerance and mutual respect.
